Looking back at our second year of the United Community Bank Foundation, we are proud of how our teams have partnered with local nonprofit organizations to make a difference in the communities we serve.

We believe in using our financial expertise to improve the lives of our customers and others that live in our communities. We are eager to partner with other committed community organizations to take action on pressing local needs. We know that, in many ways, banks are a reflection of their communities. Healthy communities and healthy banks go hand in hand. By helping our communities become stronger, we also help build a stronger future for ourselves.

Our strategy with the Foundation is to amplify the efforts of our employees as they volunteer and serve with community organizations. We focus on those organizations which are making an impact in the areas of economic empowerment, housing, youth development, and inspiration through the arts. In 2022, the Foundation supported nearly 200 organizations where our United team members volunteer.

One example of Foundation activities this year was our partnership with Habitat for Humanity affiliates in cities across our footprint. We worked with 15 Habitat affiliates in 15 counties and had over 100 United volunteers. work on building homes and supporting the mission of Habitat. They were able to build connections with each other and, more importantly, see the direct impact their work has in the lives of Habitat home recipients.

We are proud to support causes that improve the financial health of the local communities we serve. In total, the Foundation has given nearly \$825,000 in grants since it was founded in 2020. We are excited to continue our mission for years to come.

We believe in supporting programs that make a difference in our world. The arts are vital to our lives. They unite communities, improve well-being, and strengthen our economy.

Teller Scarlett Brooks gravitated to the Rome Little Theatre when she first moved to the area and was looking for ways to get involved in the community and meet new people.

The Rome Little Theatre is one of the oldest community theatres in the country and has been committed to entertaining, engaging, and educating the Rome community through the practice of theatre arts since 1933.

"Getting involved with the Rome Little Theatre when I first moved to Rome and didn't know anyone has enabled me to really get in touch with the community and connect with people with similar interests," Scarlett said.

When Scarlett started to audition and participate in plays, she quickly realized how much the Rome Little Theatre means to the community. Their commitment to furthering the cultural and educational life of the community, presenting amateur theatrical productions, and encouraging interest in drama shines through every production.

HOUSING STRATEGIES

We believe every person who dreams of homeownership should reach that goal. We want to use our skills, resources, and financial expertise to help people not just buy a house but make a home.

At United, we've devoted ourselves to financially supporting those around us while working alongside one another to build up our communities. We also recognize the need for decent and affordable housing in the areas we call home.

As part of our commitment to supporting housing strategies in our own communities, the Foundation partnered with Habitat for Humanity affiliates across our footprint in 2022. Habitat for Humanity works to build a more equitable world by helping put millions of people on the path to affordable homeownership.

"Our team is passionate about investing in our communities and helping our customers reach their housing goals from a financial perspective, and the Foundation stands behind that," said Moryah Jackson, SVP of Community Development and Engagement.

The partnership included supporting the cost of local builds and giving local team members the opportunity to volunteer. Bankers were also encouraged to collaborate with their local Habitat by sharing financial expertise with new homeowners to achieve stability, independence, and financial goals.

In 2022, United team members participated in builds across 5 states through partnerships with the following affiliates:

- Habitat for Humanity of Wake County (NC)
- Habitat for Humanity of NW Metro Atlanta (GA)
- Central SC Habitat for Humanity (SC)
- Habitat for Humanity of Greenville County (SC)
- Habitat for Humanity of Greater Nashville (TN)
- Habitat for Humanity Broward County (FL)
- Habitat for Humanity Greater Orlando and Osceola County (FL)

In total, the Foundation contributed \$94,700 to 15 affiliates in 2022. Going forward, the Foundation's goal is to continue partnering with Habitat affiliates across the Southeast by providing financial counseling to help more families achieve their dream of homeownership.

"This has been a great opportunity to give back to the communities we serve and live in, and we can't wait to see this positive impact continue throughout our communities," added Moryah.

We believe every child deserves the best support they can get, as early as they can get it. We support programs that help our children, because when we strengthen young lives, we strengthen our future.

When Alex Ponzio, President of Reliant MH, a division of United Community Bank, heard about Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Tennessee from one of his good friends, he knew immediately he wanted to get involved and become a Big Brother.

"I am a Big Brother to an 11-year-old boy whose family recently migrated from Guatemala to Knoxville. His family has very limited resources and education, so he struggles with cultural and language barriers. As an immigrant, I can relate to these struggles, and I am trying to help him navigate his transition to master his reading, writing, and overall communication skills," said Alex.

Since 1970, the vision of Big Brothers Big Sisters has been that all children achieve their full potential. They uphold a mission to create and support one-on-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth.

According to the organization, youth that have been through their programs have a higher sense of belonging, an increase in confidence, and better academic performance. Big Brothers Big Sisters serves 23 counties with more than 400 active matches in their program.

"It is my hope to inspire my mentee to want to work hard and see the value that education can add to his future. I'm glad to support Big Brothers Big Sisters, and I'm grateful to have the support of the Foundation behind it as well to impact even more lives," said Alex.
